

## Seminoles hold on to golf lead

STILLWATERS, Ala. — Florida State retained its lead in the Southern Junior-Senior golf tournament Saturday by shooting a one-over-par total of 288.

It was the best team score of the day in the 24-team tournament. The Seminoles have a two-round total of 571 and lead second-place Florida by six strokes.

The final round of the tournament will be played today.

Georgia is third (580), followed by Georgia Southern (583) and Auburn (585).

The Seminoles' Mike Grant (68-68—136) is second in the individual standings. He trails Florida's Tony DeLuca (68-66—134). The Seminoles' Grant Turner is sixth with a 71-72—143 score.

Also for FSU, Paul Azinger is at 145, Dave Boeff at 149 and Steve Keppler at 150.

## Seminole golfers win tourney

STILLWATERS Ala. — The Florida State men's golf team pulled away from the pack Sunday to win the Southern Junior-Senior Collegiate Invitational.

FSU shot 287 in the final round to finish with a six-under-par 858, 13 strokes ahead of second-place Georgia Southern. Florida was third at 878, followed by Georgia (883), Alabama (884), Auburn and Indiana (898), Mississippi (900) and Memphis State (903).

UF's Tony DeLuca was the individual winner at 207. Jodie Mudd of Georgia Southern had a 210 for second and FSU's Grant Turner took third at 211.

FSU's Mike Grant captured fifth at 216 and Steve Keppler finished ninth at 219. Paul Azinger had a 223 and Dave Boess a 221.

The Seminoles, who have won three of four tournaments, will play in the Southern Intercollegiate Championship in Birmingham this weekend.
