FSU golfers finish second

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Florida State finished second Sunday in the Southern Collegiate Invitational golf tournament.

The Seminoles had a team score of 879, two strokes

behind first-place Alabama.

FSU shot a three-over-par 291 Sunday to challenge for the title. Wake Forest was third at 885, while Memphis State was fourth at 886. Mississippi State, Georgia and Clemson tied for fifth at 889.

The Seminoles' Paul Azinger had a 73-70-72—215 total to finish third in the individual scoring. Azinger was one-under-par for the tournament. FSU's Mike Brant was seventh at 75-72-70—217.

Also for FSU, Steve Keppler finished at 75-76-73—224, Grant Turner had a 76-74-76—226 and Dave Boeff shot a 74-75-79—228.

The Seminoles have played well this season, winning three tournaments, finishing second twice and fourth once.
