Turner ties for fifth, FSU golfers finish 15th

STANFORD, Cal. — Florida State senior Grant Turner shot a 73 Saturday at the 84th NCAA Golf Championships to finish in a tie for fifth place, the best ever for a Seminole. Turner, who took 12th in 1979, finished with three-over-par 287 and broke the school record set by Todd Crandall. Crandall finished sixth in 1975 when the tournament was held at the Ohio State course.

Ron Commans of Southern California came from six strokes behind to pass defending champion Jay Don Blake and win the individual crown, while Brigham Young edged Oral Roberts for its first team title.

The Seminoles finished 15th at 1,-189, one stroke behind Florida. Paul Azinger shot a 75 to finish at 300, Steve Keppler fired a 74 for 304 and Mike Grant shot a 78 to end at 306. Paul Downes shot a 76 to finish at 308.

"It wasn't what we would have liked to do," said FSU coach Don Veller. "But we beat some pretty good teams like North Carolina, Texas, Stanford, Ohio State, Purdue and Oklahoma.

"We got pretty far behind the first day and it was rough to make it up." Veller said Turner will make one

of the All-America teams to be released early this week.
