FSU golfers slide to sixth place

COLUMBUS, Ga. — Florida State slipped one place Sunday and finished sixth with a three-day score of 913 in the Dixie Intercollegiate Golf Invitational at Bull Creek Country Club.

The tournament, which finished under nearly the same icy temperatures that forced a two-hour delay in play Saturday, was won by Georgia with an 886. Mississippi and Tennessee were tied eight strokes back at 895, followed by Auburn at 898 and Georgia Southern at 902. Miami finished seventh at 920.

Wright Waddell of Georgia won the individual competition with a two-under par 214. Jody Mudd of Georgia Southern was second at 218.

FSU, fifth after the first two rounds, was paced by Paul Downes who shot a 78 Sunday to finish 12 strokes back of Waddell at 226. FSU's Keith Kulzer finished at 229, Dave Boeff at 233, and Jonathan Morrow and Mike Keymont at 236.

FSU is off until Febuary, when Veller and his squad travel to Monterrey, Mexico to resume action.
