

Seminole golfers tied for third

MONTERREY, Mexico — The Florida State golf team is tied with Texas for third place at 286 after the first round of the Pan American International college golf tournament at Club Campestre de Monterrey.

The Seminoles were led by Stephen Keppler's 69, which is three shots behind the lead. Also, FSU's Mike Keymont held sixth place with a 70, David Blakeman was in 10th place with a 71, Bryan Mann shot a 76, and Dave Boeff shot a 77.

Oklahoma State led the first day's team standings with a 282, Oral Roberts had 283 and Texas and Florida State tied at 286.

"I'm real happy to be in second place right now," said FSU Coach Don Veller. "We're a young team and this is a strong field of teams."

Keppler is the only returning player on the FSU squad.

FSU's David Blakeman shot a 73 for an even-par 144 while Mike Keymont shot a 75 for a 145, and Brian Kamm and Dave Boeff both shot 72s and are at 148.

The Seminoles are paired with Oklahoma and Texas for the final round of play today.

Seminole golfers finish second

MONTERREY, Mexico — Florida State finished in second place with a 7 under par 857 after Saturday's final round of the Pan American International college golf tournament at Club Campestre de Monterrey.

Oklahoma State held on to win the tournament at 853. Brigham Young was third at 867, Texas A&M at 879, followed by Texas at 880, Oklahoma at 884, Oral Roberts 889, Lamar 893 and Stanford at 897.

FSU's Stephen Keppler finished second individual, posting a three-day score of 69-70-69 for an 8 under par 208. Willie Wood of Oklahoma State tied the tournament record as he won the individual honors at 201 and Andy McGee finished third at 211.

Seminole freshman David Blakeman shot 71-73-70 to finished in fourth place at 2 under par 214 while Brian Kamm shot 76-72-75 to finish 12th at 1 over par 217, Mike Keymont 70-75-73 — 218 and Dave Boeff 76-72-75 — 223.

Florida State will next compete in the 13th annual Seminole Classic, Feb. 26-28 at Seminole Golf Course.

FSU golfers are second in Pan Am tournament

MONTERREY, Mexico — Florida State moved into second place at even-par 576 after Friday's second round of the Pan American International college golf tournament at Club Campestre de Monterrey.

FSU's Stephen Keppler shot a 70 for a 2-under-par 139, six strokes behind All-American Willie Wood of Oklahoma State, who shot a 66 to lead the pack at 133.

Wood and his Oklahoma State teammates also lead the tournament at 3-under-par 573. Oklahoma is third at 578, followed by Texas and defending NCAA champ Brigham Young, both tied at 582.

The defending tournament champion, Oral Roberts, is at 583, while Stanford is at 588, Texas A&M 589, Lamar 590 and Texas Christian at 597.
