

FSU golfers first in tournament

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Playing in his first tournament of the spring, Jonathon Morrow carded a course record 9-under-par 63 for Florida State as the Seminoles fired a team 291 to take the first round lead in the 26-team Southeastern Intercollegiate Golf Invitational Friday.

Auburn is second at 299, while Miami and Kentucky are tied for third at 301. Alabama, Mississippi and Tennessee are tied for fifth at 302. Furman is eighth at 304; South Carolina ninth at 306 and North Carolina and Georgia are tied for 10th at 307.

Morrow, a sophomore from Wales, woke up Friday morning with a nose bleed, but went out in the windy weather to birdie his first three holes of play, making an eagle on his last hole. His teammate, freshman David Blakeman, is currently in second place at 69 and Tom Musselman of Kentucky is third at 71. Steve Keppler fired a 79, Mike Keymont 80 and Dave Boeff shot an 85 for the Seminoles.

Morrow, FSU golfers still in first

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Jonathon Morrow shot a second-round 77 Saturday to keep the Florida State men's golf team in first place of the 26-team Southeastern Intercollegiate.

Winds up to 40 m.p.h. bedeviled golfers all day, as only North Carolina golfer Jim Selman managed to shoot even par (72).

Morrow, who shot a course-record 63 in Friday's first round, also leads the individual standings with a 140 total. He is seven strokes ahead of teammate David Blakeman, who shot a 78 Saturday for a 147 total. Two other golfers are a stroke back of Blakeman at 148, Dick Krapfel of Auburn and Jim Gallagher of Tennessee.

As a team, FSU has carded a 597 total for a 10-stroke lead over Auburn at 607. Trailing FSU and Auburn are North Carolina (611), Georgia (612) and Tennessee (613).

The tournament ends today.

Seminoles win tourney

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Florida State fired a third-round 297 to finish at 890 and win the 26-team Southeastern Intercollegiate golf tournament Sunday.

Georgia and Auburn finished tied for second at 902, followed by Miami and Tennessee at 906. North Carolina was sixth at 907, Mississippi eighth at 917, Wake Forest ninth at 918 and South Carolina and Alabama were tied for tenth at 919.

"I'm very proud of the way the guys hung in there," said FSU head coach Don Veller. "This was our third consecutive victory and it came against some of the best schools from the east."

Seminole Jonathon Morrow carded a 74 to win individual honors at 214. Jim Gallagher of Tennessee finished second at 218 and Tim Krapfel of Auburn was third at 220.

FSU's David Blakeman fired a 74 to finish tied for fourth with Matt Avril of Miami and Brad Paxon of Furman at 221.

FSU's Mike Keymont shot a 75 for a 229 total; Dave Boeff had a 70 to finish at 232 and Steve Keppler finished at 235, carding a final-round 76.

Florida State returns to action in two weeks when it travels to Statesboro, Ga., to compete in the Chris Schenkel Invitational.
