FSU golfers finish sixth

ATHENS, Ga. — Tied for 13th after the second round, Florida State golfers shot a five-over-par 293 Saturday to finish in sixth place at 894 in the Southern Intercollegiate Invitational golf tournament.

The Bulldogs of Georgia won the tournament at 870. Tennessee was second at 872, followed by Texas at 882, East Tennessee State at 884 and Miami at 890.

Florida finished 14th at 905, and South Florida was 15th at 908.

"It was one of the biggest comebacks I've ever had in a golf team at Florida State," said FSU head coach Don Veller.

Stu Ingraham of East Tennessee State was the individual winner at 214. and David Brooks of Texas was second at 215.
