## FSU golfers seventh in invitational

Florida State's men's golf team finished seventh of 18 teams in the Andy Bean Intercollegiate Invitational at Grenlefe in Haines City this weekend.

Oklahoma won the tourney with a 54-hole, three-day total of 880, 11 strokes better than runner-up Oklahoma State.

South Carolina was third with 894, while Ohio State was fourth with 896. Florida came in fifth with a total of 900, and the University of North Carolina was sixth with 901, four strokes ahead of FSU.

Houston, the first-round leader, finished eighth at 906.

Florida State junior John Morrow shot a 73 for a 220 total, placing him ninth in the field.

The individual winner was Davis Love of North Carolina, who shot 214.

Other FSU golfers and their 54-hole totals were Greg Fleicher, 224; Nolan Henke, 233; Tom Krystryrn, 234; and Keith Kulzer 238.
