FSU's Kamm trails by a stroke

STATESBORO, Ga. — Brian Kamm of Florida State fired a 3-under-par 69 on Friday as the Seminoles finished the first day one stroke off the lead in the 14th Chris Schenkel Invitational Golf Tournament.

FSU's team score of 284 was tied for second with defending champion Oklahoma State after 18 holes of the 54-hole event. Clemson took the first-round lead with a 283.

Pete Matthews of Mississippi State fired a 67 to take the individual lead. Matthews, who birdied four of the first five holes on the par 72 Forest Heights Country Club course, took a 2-shot advantage over five other golfers — Dillard Pruitt of Clemson, Jerry Haas of Wake Forest, Andy Dillard of Oklahoma State, John Fridge of Auburn and Kamm.

Other individual scores for FSU were: Greg Fleischer (70), Tom Krystyn (72), Nolan Henke (73), and Keith Kulzer (74).

FSU golfers trail Georgia by 2 in Schenkel tournament

STATESBORO, Ga. — Florida State is two strokes behind first-place Georgia entering today's final round of the 54-hole Chris Schenkel Invitational college golf tournament.

The Seminoles shot a two-day team score of 572 to tie South Carolina for third, one shot behind second-place Ole Miss.

Pacing the Seminoles has been Greg Flescher, tied for fifth at 141 after his 71 on Saturday. Brian Kamm, 73-142, is tied for 10th.

Other FSU scores are Nolan Henke 72-145, Keith Kulzer 72-146 and Tom Chrysler 75-147.

Peter Persons fired a 3-under-par 69 Saturday to pace Georgia, and Bob Wolcott was the top Bulldog going into today's final round, with a two-day total of 141 on the Forest Heights Country Club course.

Oklahoma State's Scott Verplank held the individual lead at 138, with Clemson's Dillard Pruitt one stroke back.

Following behind in the team competition were: Mississippi State and Oklahoma State, 573; first-round leader Clemson, 577; Louisiana State, 580; host Georgia Southern, 581; Miami, 587; William and Mary, 589; Auburn, 590; Wake Forest, 591; Alabama, 593; Tennessee, 594; South Florida, 595; North Carolina State, 599; and Georgia Tech, 609.
