FSU golf team leading in Metro championship

WILD DUNES, S.C. — Florida State's men's golf team, paced by Greg Flescher's 70, is leading the Metro Golf Championship after Thursday's first round.

Florida State, with a first-round total of 292, is followed by eighthranked South Carolina at 305, Memphis State at 310 and Southern Mississippi with a 322.

Flescher is the overall tournament leader going into today's second round, and Tom Krystyn and Brian Kamm are tied for third place with a 73. Nolan Hanke shot a 76 for FSU, while Keith Kulzer shot a 79.

WILD DUNES, S.C. - FSU is a surprising 32-

stroke leader over South Carolina in the Metro Conference Golf Championship.

Florida State shot a seven-under-par 281 Friday for a total of 573, while South Carolina is a distant second at 605. Memphis State, Southern Mississippi, Virginia Tech and Louisville round out the field.

FSU's Tom Krystyn is the overall leader with a two-day total of 139. Brian Kamm and Greg Flescher, both of FSU, are tied for second place at even-par 144. Nolan Henke is currently fifth for FSU with a 148 and Keith Kulzer is eighth at 151.

FSU wins Metro golf tourney

ISLE OF PALMS, S.C. — Brian Kamm fired a 4-under-par 68 to take individual honors and his teammates took second through fourth place as the Florida State Seminoles won the Metro Conference Golf Tournament on Saturday.

FSU, which finished with a three-day total of 857, won the team championship by 49 strokes over second-place South Carolina. Memphis State was third at 929, Southern Mississippi was fourth with 936, followed by Virginia Tech (959) and Louisville (962).

Kamm, who entered the final round trailing teammate Tom Krystyn by five shots, came up with the second-best round of the tournament to edge Krystyn, who ballooned to 3-over 75 after firing a 66 the day before.

Greg Fleischer finished third overall for the Seminoles, shooting even-par 72 for a three-day total of even-par 216. Nolan Henke was fourth overall for FSU at 1-over 217.

Southern Miss' Terry Budzinski was the highest non-FSU finisher at 4-over 220. Keith Kulzer finished ninth for FSU with a 10over 226.

Florida State jumped out to a 13-stroke lead in the tournament after one day and continued to build on the advantage throughout.
