## Henke, **FSU** win Metro golf

HILTON HEAD ISLAND, S.C. Nolan Henke of Florida State fired a 4-under par 69 Saturday to win the Metro Conference golf championship and lift the Seminoles to the team title.

Henke finished with a 6-underpar 213 on the par-73 Wexford Golf Club course to beat teammate Tom Krystyn by 2 strokes. Krystyn had a final-round 70 to finish at 215.

FSU's Henke, Krystyn and Robert Maxfield all made allconference.

Coach Verlyn Giles said of his team: "I knew they were good, but I was overwhelmed by their play today. I just hope they can hold on to that between now and nationals."

Gary March of Southern Mississippi, who led Henke by 3 strokes after two rounds, had a 75 Saturday and finished third at 216.

March's teammate, Glen Hnatiuk, had a final-round 71 to finish fourth with a 217 total.

Maxfield finished fifth at 218

after a 69 on Saturday.

The Seminoles won the team title with a score of 866, easily defeating Southern Mississippi. The Golden Eagles had a 894 score.

Memphis State was third at 900, followed by South Carolina at 906, Louisville at 927, Virginia Tech at 952 and Cincinnati at 954.
