

◆ FSU MEN'S GOLF

JACKSONVILLE — In a golf tournament filled with delays and bad weather, the FSU men's team finished the final round of the University of North Florida's Queen's Harbour Intercollegiate in sixth place, 21 strokes behind champion Arkansas.

After third-round play on the par-72, 7,000-yard Queen's Harbour Yacht & Country Club Course, the Seminoles finished behind Arkansas (900), Tennessee (902), Columbus, Ga. (906), South Carolina (911) and Florida (914) with a 921 after shooting 314-308-297.

Jason Williams, a junior transfer for the Seminoles, had FSU's best finish with 79-75-72 for 226 and ninth place in his second tournament as a Seminole.

Bobby Cochran, the winner of last week's Imperial Lakes Golf Classic in Lakeland, shot a 233 and finished in a tie for 30th with teammate Christian Raynor, who came back from a first day 84 to shoot 73-76.

Ryan Perna, another junior-college transfer, finished in a tie for 34th after shooting 76-84-75 for 235. Keith Rick finished the tournament in a tie for 38th after shooting 81-81-74 for 236.

Tee times were delayed each day due to weather conditions and debris on the course.
