MONTGOMERY, Ala. — After two rounds of play at the Southeastern Intercollegiate Invitational, Florida State was in second place, two strokes behind Tennessee.

Tennessee shot a 574 on the first day of action while Florida State shot a 576. Alabama is third with a 580, Florida is fourth with a 582 and Auburn and South Alabama are tied for fifth with a 583.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — The Florida State men's golf team won the Southeastern Intercollegiate Invitational with a three-round total of 866 (290-286-290), five strokes ahead of second-place finisher Florida, ranked fifth in the nation.

FSU was led by Ryan Perna, who tied for third, five strokes behind the tournament champion, Brian Slevin of Georgia. Perna, a junior from Boca Raton, jumped from ninth place, shooting 74-70-71 for a 215 to tie with Martin Olander of Alabama and Steven Smith of Tennesee.

Christian Raynor finished sixth with a 216. The junior from Gulf Breeze shot a 73 and 68 on the first day of competition and a 75 in the third round.

Other finishers for the Seminoles included Bobby Cochran, who tied for ninth with 71-71-76 for a 218; Keith Rick, a junior from Boca Raton who shot a 71 for a total of 221 and 21st place; and Jason Williams, who placed 57th with a 76-78-73 for 227.
