Men's golf tied for 22nd at NCAAs

The Florida State men's golf team is tied for 22nd after the first round of the NCAA Championships at Stonebridge Country Club in McKinney, Texas. There are 30 teams.

The Seminoles, who qualified for the NCAAs for the first time in four years, shot 295 and are 16 strokes behind leader Arkansas. Oklahoma State is second at 286. Auburn and East Tennessee State are tied for third at 287. Florida is fifth at 288.

Ken Staton led Florida State, firing a one-underpar 71. He is two strokes behind Tag Ridings and Steven Bright, both from Arkansas, Ryan Hietala of UTEP and Kris Cox of Oklahoma State, Ryan Perna and Christian Raynor each shot 73's and are tied for 49th. Bobby Cochran is in a tie for 140th after shooting a 79. Denny Tymosko is in a tie for 150th. He shot an 84.

The four-round tournament runs through Saturday.

Golf team misses cut, Staton qualifies

The Florida State men's golf team finished 16th after two rounds and missed the cut by one stroke, but **Ken Staton** qualified as an individual in the NCAA Men's Golf Championships in Mckinney, Texas.

Florida State entered the day in a tie for 22nd place and shot a second-round 286 for a total of 582. FSU finished one stroke behind Arizona, Auburn, Kent and Wake Forest. Stanford is the team leader with a two-day total of 565, two strokes better than secondplace Arkansas. Florida and Georgia Tech are tied for third at 570, and Oklahoma State rounds out the top five at 572.

Staton matched his first-round score of 71 and is in a tie for 10th place, seven shots behind co-leaders Mikko Rantanen of Georgia Tech and Notah Begay of Stanford.

Staton ties for 35th place

Florida State's Ken Staton shot a final round 76 and finished in a tie for 35th place at the NCAA Golf Championships at Stonebridge Country Club in McKinney, Texas, on Saturday afternoon.

Former U.S. amateur champion Justin Leonard of Texas tied the 72-hole record at 17-under-par and won the individual medal.

His score tied the four-round record by John Inman of North Carolina in 1984.

Leonard won by five shots over Alan Bratton of Oklahoma State, who shot 73.

Staton's four-day total of 290 (71-71-72-76) was 19 shots behind winner Justin Leonard of Texas.

Stanford won the team title with a score of 1129, four strokes better than runner-up Texas. It was the seventh NCAA title for Stanford which won in 1938, 1941, 1942, 1946 and 1953.
