GREENSBORO, NC-Florida State All-American candidate Bobby Cochran was named Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year while Christian Raynor also was placed on the All-ACC team voted by the league's nine head coaches.

Cochran earned player of the year honors after winning both the Dixie Intercollegiate, held in Columbus, Georgia and the ImperialLakes Classic in Mulberry, Florida. Cochran, the first Florida State golfer to acquire the honors, finished in second place in three of his tournaments this year, and only finished out of the top 20 twice during the season.

Raynor finished in second place in two tournaments this season, third in another, and tied for 10th at the ACC Tournament in Rocky Mount, North Carolina.

Also on the ten member team are Rob Bradley from North Carolina, Stewart Cink and Mikko Rantanen of Georgia Tech, Simon Cooke of Virginia, Kevin Kemp and Ron Whittaker of Wake Forest, Del Ponchock of Maryland, and Mark Slawter of North Carolina State.

EAST LANSING, MI- The Florida State women's golf team is in fourth place out of the nineteen competing teams at the Women's NCAA East Regional. FSU fired a first round 318 and are four strokes behind third place Tennessee and nine strokes behind team leader Duke.

Tiffany Faucette leads the Lady Seminoles in a tie for sixth with a first round 77, seven strokes behind leader Stephanie Neill. Karen Stupples is in 12th place after carding a 78.

Other Lady Seminoles include Maria Castellucci and Mabel Pascual del Pobil in a tie for 31st after shooting 81s, and Kate Burton in a tie for 53rd after shooting an 83.

The Women's NCAA East Regional runs through Saturday.

Florida State senior Bobby Cochran was named first team All-American, the All-American Collegiate Foundation announced Monday night.

Cochran finished the year with a 72.13 stroke average in becoming the first golfer from Florida State to be named first team All-American since Nolan Henke in 1987, and the eleventh overall.

On his way to earning All-America, Cochran won the The Dixie Intercollegiate, The Imperial Lakes Classic, and The Wofford Invitational. In seventeen of thirty-six rounds Cochran shot under par. He shot ten rounds in the 60's, including an astounding eight-under-par 64 in the second round of the Wofford Invitational, an event he won by six strokes.

Other individuals selected to the team include Alan Bratton and Kris Cox of Oklahoma State, Todd Dempsey of Arizona, Patrick Lee of Oklahoma, Justin Leonard of Texas, Chris Riley of UNLV, and Bud Still of Arkansas.
