

#### FSU in 16th place

NEW HAVEN, Conn. — Florida State shot an opening-round 297 for 16th place at the NCAA East Regional tournament at Yale Golf Course.

The ACC holds three of the top five spots. Clemson leads with a 282, two strokes better than North Carolina. Central Florida and East Tennessee State are tied for third after both schools shot a 288. Wake Forest rounds out the top five after shooting an opening day 289.

Christian Raynor leads the Seminoles. He is tied for 12th with a 71. Richard Fulford is in 26th with a 72, and Ken Stanton is 50th with a 74. Denny Tymosko is 104th with

an 80 while George McNeil is 107th with an 81.

The tournament concludes Saturday.
