FSU Men's golf team finishes 8th at ReliaStar Invitational
September 18, 1995

DELLWOOD, MN--The Florida State men's golf team opened up the 1995-96 season, finishing 8th (903) in the ReliaStar Collegiate Golf Invitational held at the par 72, Dellwood Hills Golf Club. The Seminoles were led by Richard Fulford, who shot a three round total of 224, good enough to tie him for 17th place. Jason Pool finished one stroke behind Fulford, while newcomer Steve Carrington ended up with 229.

The Louisiana State Tigers won the tournament with a score of 874. Northwestern came in second with 885, and the host Golden Gophers finished 3rd at 886.

University of Minnesota golfer Aaron Barber was the individual champion with a fifty-four hole total of 215. P.J. Smith of LSU, Scott Rowe of Northwestern, and Jay Osmon of Colorado State tied for 2nd place at 217.

The first two rounds of the tournament were completed on Sunday, while the third round was played today. The scores of the tournament were determined by taking the best four-out-of-five scores from each school.

Barber Wins ReliaStar Collegiate Invitational; LSU Takes Team Title

University of Minnesota senior All-America candidate Aaron Barber carded an even par 72 to win the ReliaStar Collegiate Golf Invitational by two strokes. Barber finished with a three-round total of 215 to garner his first collegiate tournament victory. Scott Rowe of Northwestern fired a 69 on the final day to finish in a three-way tie for second with Jay Osman of Colorado State and P.J. Smith of LSU. Alan Stearns of Kansas and B.J. Schlagenhauf of UCLA were tied for fifth at 218. Brian Payne of Northwestern and Brian Bateman of LSU were tied for seventh at 219. Joe Ogilvie of Duke was ninth at 220. D.A. Points of LSU, Jeff Fugimoto of Colorado State and Adam Dooley of Minnesota were tied for 10th at 221.

Louisiana State was led to the team title by P.J. Smith and D.A. Points who carded 67 and 68 respectively on the last day. The Tigers came from six strokes behind the Golden Gophers on the final day to win by 11 strokes over Northwestern. They shot seven under par as a team on the final round to finish at 874. Minnesota shot a final-round 299 to fall into a tie for third with Colorado State at 886, while Northwestern finished second at 885. UCLA was fifth at 889, Kansas was sixth at 895, Duke was seventh at 901, Florida State was eighth at 903, Michigan and Iowa tied for ninth at 914, Vanderbilt was 11th at 920, and Rhode Island was 12th at 923 to round out the team scoring.
