

FSU's Miles Just Misses Gymnastic Win

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. —(AP) John M. Miles of Florida State University was only three tenths of a point away from a title here Friday after the long horse event of the National AAU Gymnastic Championships.

But the crown went to Archie Durham of Pasadena, Cal., City College, who amassed 56.9 out of a possible 60 points in the only title-deciding event of the day.

Al Ruda of Florida State wound up in a tie for sixth place.

After today's finals, eight men and eight women will be selected for the United States' Olympic gymnastic squad.

Phila.'s Stout, Lomady Gain Top Olympic Gym Spots

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., April 26 (UP).—Bob Stout, 26-year-old Philadelphia school teacher earned the No. 1 berth on Uncle Sam's Olympic gymnastic team tonight by taking the all-around title in a stunning upset.

Stout, former Temple University ace, and Intercollegiate champ, won National AAU horizontal bar and all-around titles to pace the Philadelphia Turners to a surprise team victory over favored Florida State gymkana.

MRS. LOMADY WINS

In the women's division Mrs. Clara Schroth Lomady, also of Philadelphia Turners, swept three of four events to win National all-around honors for the fourth straight year, and top billing on the Olympic team for the second time.
