

FSU Entries Win Places In Gym Meet

CHICAGO, May 1.—(AP)—Robert Stout of the Philadelphia Turners set a gymnastic record Friday with 570 total points to win the Longhorse competition in the National AAU gymnastics meet.

Stout's score topped by five points the record set last year by defending titlist Archie Durham, Pasadena City College, Calif. Durham did not participate in the current meet at the University of Illinois, Navy pier.

In the second division of events completed Friday, Don Holder of Florida State Gymkana, Tallahassee, Fla., got 212 points to take the title in Indian clubs competition.

Compulsory exercises for men in three other events—sidehorse, still rings and trampoline—were completed with optional exercises slated for Saturday.

Other winners in the two events completed today were:

FSU Gymnasts Pile Up Points In Nationals

CHICAGO, May 2, (AP)—Four new records highlighted competition Saturday in the National AAU gymnastics meeting at the University of Illinois, Navy Pier.

Bob Stout of the Philadelphia Turners, piled up 58.5 points in the free calisthenics event to top the 1952 record of 56.4 set by Gene Constedt of Pennsylvania State.

In the trampoline competition, Richard Gutting of Florida State Gymkana, Tallahassee, got 28.5 points to beat the record of 27.9 set by Frank Ladue, University of Iowa, last year.

George Wilker of the Los Angeles Turners, defending champion in the still rings division, beat his 1952 mark of 56.4 with a 57.9 total.

In women's competition, Ruth Grulkowski, of Acro Theater, University of Chicago, set a new record in the sidehorse vault with 56.3 points.

Bill Roetzheim of Florida State won the sidehorse event with 56.6 points.
