

FSU Swimmers Upset Georgia Team 38-37

The Florida State University swimming team scored its first victory of the season yesterday afternoon when they upset the University of Georgia tank squad 38-37 before 350 fans in the East Campus pool.

The Seminoles, who had dropped a decisive 52-23 decision to the Bulldogs in Athens and suffered defeats at the hands of Emory and Miami, set three pool records as they raced to five first places and a victory.

After Georgia had taken triumphs in the 300-yard medley and 200-yard free style to open the meet, the Seminoles chalked up successive triumphs in the 50-yard free style, diving and 100-yard free style.

Georgia took the 150-yard backstroke event but the Indians splashed home in front in the 200-yard breast stroke and 400-yard free style to clinch the victory.

The Bulldogs took the final event, the 400-yard free style relay.

Cochran Stars

Frank Cochran paced FSU to its triumph with a pair of record-breaking victories in the 50 and 100-yard free style events.

The Tallahassee boy established a new pool mark of 25.2 in the 50 and 56.4 in the 100.

Walter Jardine, a standout point maker all winter, set the other record in the 400-yard free style in 4:54.2.

Roger Slater added the fourth win in the diving event while Bud Browning completed the string of firsts by grabbing the 200-yard breast stroke.
