

FSU SWIMMERS DEFEAT EMORY

Score 41-21 Win In Home Pool

The Florida State University swimming team scored its second win of the season yesterday afternoon when it registered a 41-21 triumph over Emory University in the east campus pool.

The Seminoles, gaining revenge for an early season 43-32 setback suffered at the hands of the Georgia tankmen, led all the way in registering the triumph.

Mark Brown turned in a double victory for the Seminole squad as he splashed home ahead in the 200 and 400 free style events.

FSU won both the 300 yards and 450 yard free style relay events, and added a triumph in the diving events as Don Wehsinger topped his Seminole mates. Emory did not enter the springboard event.

Tiny Pennington, Emory star, broke the existing pool record for the 50-yard free style event when he turned in a time of 26 seconds flat.

The triumph was the second of the season for the Seminoles in their home pool. Last week they defeated the University of Georgia. On the road they have bowed to Emory, Georgia, Miami and Pensacola Navy.

Emory Bows In Swim Meet

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. — (AP) — Florida State University's swimming team won a 41-21 victory in a dual meet with Emory University here yesterday.

The only winner of two events was FSU's Mark Brown who took both the 200 and 400-yard free style swims.
