

FSU TANKMEN TACKLE TECH

Meet Here Saturday;
Top Georgia 46-29

Defeated by a 46-29 victory over the University of Georgia, the Florida State University swimming team will go out after its second successive win over a Southeastern conference foe Saturday afternoon when they meet Georgia Tech in the East Campus pool at 6.

The Tech Yellow Jackets are defending SEC champs, and have dropped one 49-33 verdict to Georgia during early season meets.

Five Pool Records

Five pool records were shattered here yesterday afternoon as the Seminoles splashed to their win over Georgia.

Coach HUI SIUJA Indians set the tempo for the meet when they grabbed the opening event, the 300-yard medley relay in record time. FSU was never headed after that initial win.

Other pool marks were established in the 100, 220 and 440 yard free style races and in the 400-yard free style relay.

Seminole Captain Walt Jardine hung up the new record in the 440, while the meet's only double winner, Georgia's Charlie Cooper, set marks in the 100 and 220. FSU's relay team hacked almost seven seconds off the old record in winning the 400-yard free style relay.

The victory gave FSU a season mark of 2-2, and the defeat was Georgia's second against five wins.
