## **FSU Swimmers Win**

Florida State University's strong swimming team opened its 1951 season with a real splash last night, defeating the University of Georgia Bulldogs 43-32 before a capacity crowd at the East Campus pool.

Led by Co-captain Walt Jardine and Dick Wells, who both smashed pool records and Jack White who tied one mark, the Seminoles swept to victory in seven of the nine events.

Jardine swam the 200-yard freestyle in 2:06.8 seconds to break one record. Wells did the 100yard freestyle in 54.5 seconds to break the other.

White tied the 50-yard freestyle mark of 24.6 seconds.

FSU meets the Pensacola Navy in Pensacola Saturday afternoon and Georgia swims against Florida in Gainesville today.
