

Jardine, Slater Cop First Places

ATLANTA, March 3. (P)—Florida State and North Carolina State A A swimming teams tonight wound up in a tie for the Southern AAU team title with both dunking Georgia in the final 400 yard free style event.

Florida State, winner of the final event, and the N C State each scored 36 points. Georgia was third with 34, followed by Miami with 23, Florida with 14, Georgia Freshmen with 7, Louisville YMCA with 7, Georgia Tech 6, Cloudmont, Ala. 6, and Northwestern Louisiana 3.

Outstanding performer was Georgia's free styler Charley Cooper of Augusta—the meet's high-point-man—with 13½.

Cooper won the 220 and 100 yard free style and also swam on Georgia's third place free style relay team. Cooper's 220 time of 2:15.8 bettered the old SEAAU mark of 2:16.4 set by Bill Dudley of the New Orleans A C in 1949.

Georgia's Charley Guyer was second high scorer with 10.4 points.

Georgia won the Georgia AAU team title with 81 points, followed by Georgia Tech—27; Emory—16; Emory AC 15, Georgia Freshmen 14, Atlanta AC, 4, North Side High A team 4, Georgia Tech Porpoise Club 2 and North Side High B team 2.
