

## Tribe Swimmers Break 2 Records

AUSTIN, Tex., Mar. 31.—Two Florida State University school records fell here today in the annual National Collegiate Athletic Association's swimming meet.

The Seminole swimmers bettered the 400-yard free style mark with a time of three minutes 39.4 seconds in finishing ninth, and Dick Wells established a new school record in the 100-yard free style. Although Wells failed to qualify, he swam the dash in 53.2 seconds.

Florida State's All-America diver, Roger Slater, placed sixth in low board diving and tenth in high board diving in the meet.

NCAA marks in the 100-yard backstroke and 440-yard freestyle fell in qualifying preliminaries also.

John Marshall, Australian speedster from Yale, broke his fifth record in three dips in the water in the distance freestyle event in 4 minutes 33.4 seconds.

## FSU Swimmers In Nationals

COLUMBUS, O.—Four members of the Florida State University swimming team arrived here yesterday with Coach Bim Stults and will compete in the National AAU meet in the Ohio State University pool Friday and Saturday. There are 42 teams entered with Yale University, NCAA champion, the favorite.

The Florida State swimmers at Columbus are all free stylers and will make up a team to enter the 400-yard free style relay event. The Seminole natators finished ninth in a large field in the 400 at the NCAA meet in Austin, Texas, last week.

Anchoring the Florida State relay team will be Dick Wells of Orlando, who will also swim in the 100 and 50 yard dash events. Captain Walter Jardine of Lake Worth, number three man, will be entered in the 100 as an individual, as will Pete Dunn-Rankin of Winter Park and Jack White of Clearwater. White may also swim in the 50 as he did at the NCAA meet.

Rodger Slater, the Seminoles' great diver from Akron, Ohio, who finished 8th in the low board and 10th from the high board in last week's NCAA meet, was not able to come to Columbus with the team.
