

FSU Loses By One Point In AAU Meet

ATLANTA, Feb. 28 (AP)—A University of Georgia disqualification in the 400-yard relay victory bumped Miami's powerful Hurricane into the Southern Region AAU swimming championship by one point at the Emory University pool tonight.

Reid Patterson, a Bulldog tank-dman was the meet's outstanding swimmer.

Georgia won the state AAU division of the tank meet and only their disqualification knocked them from the southern championship. Final score in the swim placed Miami ahead with 78 points with FSU second at 77 and Georgia third with 62.

Georgia disqualified in the 400-yard relay event when one swimmer failed to touch the end of the pool on a turn.

Patterson led the Bulldogs' desperate bid, setting two records, one—a national mark. He lowered the 150-yard backstroke time to 1:35.0 in afternoon trials breaking a 1947 mark.

The other record was the 50-yard freestyle when he timed off at :23.1.
