Gators, Flying L's Take Honors In AAU Swim Meet

GAINESVILLE, March 14.- (A)-Victories by the University of Florida and Fort Lauderdale High School highlighted the Florida AAU swimming championship here

The Florida Gators, who last weekend won the Southeastern Conference title, won six out of 10 collegiate events to accumulate 103 points and win the indoor meet. Florida State University, winner of the other four events, was second behind the Gators with 80 points.

Fort Lauderdale came out on top in the 220-yard freestyle relay and won the annual high school trophy presentation. Their winning time was 1:44.4, with Coral Gables and Miami Jackson placing second and third behind them.

Sophomore Ted Robinson of Jacksonville was Florida's big scoring gun-winning the 100 and 200yard breast stroke event and anchoring the Gators' first place 300yard medley relay team. Luis Child, a former South American Olympian distance man, won firsts in the 220 and 440 free style events, turning in a 2:22.4 performance in the 220.

For the first four events Florida was only 3 points ahead of FSU. But the Gators' scoring barrage started in the diving competition. Florida's "big three" in diving-Chuck Martin, Jim Borland, and Ronnie Patrick won first, second, and third places in that order. Martin, a former All-American high school diver, wound up with a sensational 509 points.

. Other teams scoring points in the meet were Coral Gables, 11; Jacksonville Navy, 11: and Fort Lauderdale, 10.
