Florida State's undefeated Seminoles and the Georgia Bulldogs set eight new pool records here last night as FSU won a dual swimming meet, 49-35.

It was the first loss for Georgia, second in the Southeastern Conference last season.

Florida State's George Hirshberger and Ernie Stock racked up new school marks. A freshman, Hirshberger was clocked in 2:18.8 in the 220-yard freestyle and Stock at 1:36.6 in the 150-yard individual medley.

Individual standout for the meet, though, was Georgia's All-America swimmer, Reid Patterson. The lanky Kentucky senior set new pool records in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle events and

paced Georgia's 400-yard freestyle relay team to a new pool mark.
