

The powerful Texas Aggies snapped Florida State's dual meet victory string at 24 here Wednesday night, splashing to a 49 1/2-34 1/2 triumph over the Tribe tank-men in the Womens' gym. A&M led all the way.

The loss was the first for the Seminoles this season after three straight wins. The Aggies, winners of the Texas Relays earlier this campaign, are undefeated.

FIVE A PIECE

Each squad won five first places Wednesday night but the winners displayed superior depth, particularly in the 220- and 440-yd. freestyles, in which the Aggies captured both first and second places. Graham Teschke, FSU's entry in these events, was hampered by a flu but managed to finish a strong third in both.

Eleven records were set in the meet. Seven meet marks were established, three new pool standards were set and one school record went by the boards.

Only two swimmers were multi-winners Wednesday night. FSU's Jim Julian and A&M star Tetsuo Okamoto each grabbing a pair of first places.

Julian won both the 50- and 100-yd. freestyle events, setting a meet and school record in the former and a meet standard in the latter.

POOL RECORD

Okamoto, a sophomore, set new pool and meet records while winning the 220-yd. freestyle and established a new meet mark in the 440-yd. freestyle.

Florida State faces Kentucky in Lexington tonight and travels to the home grounds of Vanderbilt Saturday night for another SEC clash with the Commodores. The Seminoles return home Feb. 11 in a meet with Georgia Tech.
