COLLEGE STATION, Texas—

Florida State's powerful swimming team broke Texas A&M's 13-meet victory record here last night, 52-34.

The Seminoles' upset was a measure of revenge for the victory the Aggies posted in Tallahassee last year.

The strong FSU relay teams proved the big factor. FSU set a new pool record in the very first event, the 400-yard medley relay when the team of Ken Abbott, Joel Jacobs, Mike Tschirret, and Jhn Julian did the job in 4:10.0.

FSU swimmers also captured the 400-yard freestyle relay event with a good time of 3:48.9.

The Tribe clinched the meet when Joel Jacobs broke his own record in the 200 breaststroke with a time of 2:2.9. Jacobs' previous mark, set in 1955, was 2:37.4.

A&M sensational Jimmy Okamoto dominated the distance races, taking first place wins in both the 220 and 440 freestyle events.

The Seminoles move on to Dallas Friday for the final meet of their week's tour of Texas, facing Southern Methodist.
