ATHENS, Ga.—Florida State's swimming team overwhelmed a good Georgia squad here yesterday afternoon to take a 60-25 decision.

The win gave the Seminoles a season's mark of six victories against two set-backs.

The Tribe swimmers won seven first places in the 10 events, with Georgia's Don Hankston taking two firsts for the Bulldogs in the 220 and 440 yard distance swims. The other Georgia first came when Dave McNutt took first place in diving.

FSU's medley relay team set a new school and pool record in the 400 medley relay with a time of 4:03.5.

The Seminoles' Ryan Ray swam the 50 yards dash in 28.4 seconds.
