BIRMINGHAM, Ala.—Florida State's powerful swimmers swept all ten events and set six new pool records here last night as they defeated Birmingham Southern, 63-15.

With the triumph boosting their season's record to three wins against a single setback, they move on to Lexington, Ky., where they dual Kentucky's Wildcats tonight.

Fourteen of FSU's points came when the Seminoles captured both the 400-yard medley relay and the 400-yard freestyle relay on record times for the Birmingham pool.

Coach Bim Stults used his front line swimmers sparingly and none came home a double winner. But four FSU swimmers set new pool standards for their individual events.

Paul Hammond slipped under

the rope to set a new mark in the 220-yard freestyle, and Ken Abbott flashed home first with a new pool record for the 50-yard freestyle.

Mike Glancy and Tom Newell established the other new marks, in the 200-yard backstroke and the 200-yard breaststroke.

The win over Birmingham Southern successfully opened the FSU swimmers' road swing which will keep them busy every night this week. After the Kentucky meet tonight, they meet Louisville in an exhibition in Fremont, Ohio, and dual Oberlin

College of Ohio on successive nights.
