Florida State's swimmers used reserve power here last night to defeat Georgia Tech, 54-30.

A near capacity crowd watched the once-beaten Seminoles win eight of 10 events with many of their performers swimming exhibition.

The triumph stretched FSU's record to seven wins against a single setback and set the stage for the clash with arch-rival Florida here next Saturday night.

Three meet records fell during the contest. FSU's Ken Abbott swept home in the 50-yard free style in a time of :23.5 to set a new standard for that event.

Tom Metz of FSU methodically stroked his way to a new meet record of 5:14.3 in the 440 yard freestyle.

The third new mark was set by Georgia Tech's Bob Dudley even though, he was outdistanced by Metz who was swimming exhibition. Dudley's winning time was 2:20.7.
