

Flashing to four new school records in championship time, Florida State's improving swimmers closed out their 1958 home schedule with a convincing 54-32 thrashing of Miami's Hurricanes here last night.

It was a night for broken records as Miami's Jack Nelson swam the 200-yard butterfly event in the swiftest time ever recorded in a Florida swimming pool. A 1956 Olympic team member, Nelson was clocked in 2:12.4 seconds, 12.2 seconds faster than the previous FSU pool record set by Florida's Phil Drake in 1957.

Coach Bim Stults' Seminoles won the opening race in record time and easily recorded their eighth dual triumph against a single loss and a 43-43 tie with Florida. It was Miami's first loss after two victories.

FSU freestyler Ken Abbott turned in brilliant efforts in both the 50 and 100-yard freestyle sprints. The Birmingham senior swam the 50 in a sparkling 23.2 seconds to break teammate Ryan Ray's school record and tie the pool record established by Georgia Olympic standout Reid Patterson in 1954.

Then Abbott came back to swim the 100 in even more remarkable time, turning in a :51.3 reading that may win him All-America recognition. It was only two-tenths of a second off Patterson's pool record of :51.1 set in 1954.

FSU's Bob Jacobs took care of another school mark. The Fort Lauderdale senior tossed the 200-yard breaststroke course in 2:44.8, almost a full second faster than his previous school standard.

Jim Wentworth, Jacobs, Don Lewis, and Paul Hammond hung up a school record in the 400-yard medley relay, teaming for a 4:08.5 effort.

Superman Bob Weber, son of the top-notch diving form, teamed with teammate Bill Simpson for the hard honors, Scott Seminoles being impressive in winning the 200 and 440-yard freestyle events.

The Seminoles won eight of 10

first places and used their second-line freestyle relay team after they had the meet wrapped up. FSU swims Georgia's Bulldogs at Athens Saturday night, closes out its dual season against Florida at Gainesville March 15.
