ATHENS, Ga., March 1 —

Florida State's powerful swimmers stacked up an early 26-9 margin and coasted to their 11th straight victory over Georgia's bulldogs, 55-31, here today.

It was the ninth dual victory against a single setback and a tie for Coach Bim Stults' Seminoles.

FSU senior Ken Abbott of Birmingham continued his mastery in the 50 and 100-yard freestyle events, as did sophomore Bob Weber in diving. Senior Joel Jacobs of Fort Lauderdale kept his hot streak alive by winning his specialty — the 200-yard breaststroke — in 2:35.5.

Georgia's Jimmy Bankston was the Bulldog's top threat, sweeping firsts in the 200 and 440 freestyle races.

FSU will be idle until March 15, when the Seminoles close their dual schedule in a return match with Florida's Gators in Gainesville.
