ANN ARBOR, Mich.—Florida State's Bob Weber, probably the Southeast's top collegiate diver at the moment, arrived here today for the 1958 NCAA swimming and diving championships.

Weber, a sophomore from Charleston, W. Va., will represent Florida State in both the one and three-meter diving events as the NCAA meet opens a three-day run here Thursday. Weber, one of few sophomores competing for the NCAA diving crown, is accompanied by Florida State swimming coach Bim Stults.

"We think Weber has great potential," Stults said. "In order for Bob to bring himself up to top-flight form, he must dive against the best competition in the nation."

ANN ARBOR, Mich.—Florida State University's Bob Weber made his national debut in the NCAA diving championships here by showing promise in both the low and high board events.

Weber, a sophomore from Charleston, W. Va., placed 17th in low board competition among 28 of the nation's finest divers. He finished 14th among 26 entries in high board diving.

Weber was accompanied here by Florida State Coach Bim Stults, who will take a four-man Seminole contingent, including Weber, to the national AAU meet at New Haven, Conn., next week.
