**ATLANTA**—Former All-American high school diver Bob Weber won a clear-out decision in low-board diving to give Florida State's swimming team a slight edge in the opening of the two-day Georgia AAU swim meet here last night.

Weber, a hard-working junior from Charleston, W. Va., pilled up 437.15 points to easily out-point Emory's Barry Verkauff.

FSU freshman Dennis Flandreau earned fourth place and Seminole junior Bill Simpson of Montgomery, Ala., was sixth. Another Seminole diving standout, Curtis Genders, was unable to participate because of the flu.

After their third straight Georgia AAU crown, Coach Bim Stults' squad took an 8-6 lead over Florida's Gators. The Seminole freshman team was in third place with three points.

Heavy action, including high-board diving and numerous swimming events, is scheduled today. Finals are set for the Emory University pool tonight. Nearly 200 high school and college delegates from throughout the South are competing.

**ATLANTA (AP)** — The Florida State University men's swimming team won the Emory University Invitational swim championships tonight with a total of 98 points. Georgia Military Academy was second in the men's division with 81 points followed by the University of Florida with 65. FSU Freshman 35, Atlanta Independent Swim Assn. 24, Swainville 3, Vanderbilt 3, Emory University 3, Mar 1 and the University of Kentucky 1.
