An overflow audience of some 500 watched the Seminoles shatter 10 records in rewarding Coach Bim Stults with his 75th collegiate swim victory at FSU.

The one-sided verdict was the most decisive over Jack Ryan's Gators since FSU inaugurated the series with a 66-18 victory in 1956. And it gave the Seminoles 4-2-1 advantage in the heated rivalry.

Senior Jerry Glancy put the Tribe on top to stay with a 2:15.0 record clocking in the 200 backstroke, Hiles breezed in the 440 freestyle and Howie Fillmore and Bud Cole wrapped up the 200-yard breastroke:
