The night's closest scrap developed between FSU's flashy sophomore, Buck Hiles, and Miami's Jack Nelson in the 200. yard butterfly, A former Olymple busterly are Nemon had to crack his own pool record sec last year in coming from behind to nip Hiles by a hand. Nelson's time was a standout 2:11.3.

It was the first variety race dropped by Hiles.
