

Senior Jerry Glancy enjoyed his first hour as a Florida State swimmer last night, hanging up a 200-yard backstroke record in a 51-35 Seminole verdict over Miami's dead-game Hurricanes.

Hard-working Glancy trimmed 1.2 seconds off his school and pool backstroke standard set only five days ago against Florida. His 2:13.8 performance was more than five seconds swifter than the previous meet record.

Coach Bim Stuhs, nursing an aching arm, juggled his lineup considerably. The Seminoles responded with their fourth triumph in five dual starts and their ninth victory in 12 meets with Miami.

The night's closest scrap developed between FSU's flashy sophomore, Buck Hiles, and Miami's Jack Nelson in the 200-yard butterfly. A former Olympic butterfly ace, Nelson had to crack his own pool record set last year in coming from behind to nip Hiles by a hand. Nelson's time was a standout 2:11.3.

It was the first varsity race dropped by Hiles.

FSU won six of the 10 events, with Bill Simpson, Paul Hammond, Tom Metz, Bud Cole and Glancy taking individual firsts. Georgia Tech and Georgia will provide freshman and varsity opposition for the Seminoles in a two-meet road trip Friday and Saturday.
