Seminole sophomore Buck Hiles capped a brilliant first year, of varsity competation with a sixth-place finish in the finals of the 440-yard freestyle event. His sixth-place showing — he swam the 440 in school-record time of 4:36.9 in the trials—qualified him for All-America honors.

At Ithaca, Stults was elected second vice-president of the American College Swimming Couches Assn. Joe Rogers of the University of Massachusetti was elected president.
