

Home-grown sophomore Paul Thompson set a meet, school and pool record in the 220-yard freestyle as Florida State scored a 56-34 swimming victory over Georgia Tech here yesterday.

Thompson, former Leon High standout, edged his All-America teammate, junior Buck Hiles of Atlanta, by an arm's length in record time of 2:08.0 Hiles held the former school record of 2:08.6, set last year.

The old pool record was 2:14.1, set by Texas A & M's Paul Akamuto here in 1956.

The Thompson-Hiles race was the closest of the meet. Coach Bim Stults' Seminoles won nine of 11 events in taking their second dual victory against no losses this season.

Senior Tom Newell paced the Seminoles with two first-place finishes, winning the 200-yard individual medley and 200-yard breaststroke events.

Bob Abstein and Gerry Braden each won an individual first and had a hand in FSU's winning 400-yard medley relay team. Sophomore Denny Flandreau turned in a fine effort in winning diving honors.

Bob Dudley gave Tech its only

individual first in the 100-yard freestyle.

FSU's next start is at Seawanee, Feb. 1.
