Now 5-0 for the season, the Seminoles have remaining meets with Southeastern Conference champion Florida (two). Georgia, and East Carolina.

Buck Hiles, junior All-America from Atlanta, spurred the win over Bowling Green with three first places, setting a pool record in the 440-yard freestyle with a time of 4:49.8.

But it was a strong overall team effort that brought FSU its three triumphs on the road.
