**GAINESVILLE** — Florida State swimmers surged back from a loss in the first event to a 50-45 victory over the University of Florida here yesterday.

The victory gave the Seminoles their fourth unbeaten season in ten years under the direction of Coach Bim Stultz.

Stultz shoved his best swimmers into the opening medley relay event in order to win, but Florida took the race with a time of 3:57.9, a new record.

Buck Hiles, a double-winner for FSU, came back to win the 220 freestyle after two minutes rest.

Hiles other victory was in the 200-yard butterfly.

FSU's Paul Thompson also won two events, taking the individual medley and the 100-yard freestyle.
