

MIAMI — Florida State's untiring swimmers concluded a brilliant team season here yesterday, capturing their second straight Florida Intercollegiate championship.

The Seminoles did it the hard way, winning seven of the 10 individual events to shade Florida's Gators by six points. FSU rolled up 120 points to 114 for the Southeastern Conference champion Gators. Miami finished a distant third with 40 points.

It was the final team competition for the Tribe, which won 10 straight dual meets and annexed the Georgia AAU title earlier this year.

Buck Hiles, the All-America junior, and Paul Thompson, the Tallahassee sophomore who is bearing down on All-America honors, turned in iron-man performances for FSU.

Hiles won the 100-yard butterfly, the 200-yard butterfly, and set a meet record in the 400-yard freestyle. Thompson set meet records in winning the 100 and 200-yard freestyle events and pitched in with a second place in the 100-backstroke, won by teammate Glenn Mitchell. Thompson's 1:56.3 clocking in the 200 freestyle also was a school record.
