DALLAS, Tex.—Four members of FSU's swimming team get a final chance for honors in the annual NCAA championships here today.

Bob Weber and Curt Genders will compete in high-board (3-meter) diving and Paul Thompson and Buck Hiles in the 440-yard freestyle.

Genders finished 9th and Weber 10th in low-board (1-meter) diving earlier. Their performances may assure them of All-America honors for the second straight year.

In one of the most talented fields ever assembled, Thompson finished 12th and Hiles 18th in the 220-yard-freestyle-finals. In the process, Thompson set a new FSU school 220 record of 2:07.5. DALLAS, Tex. — The swiftest competition in NCAA swimming history marked the 1960 champlonships that ended here yesterday, as four Florida State athletes can attest.

All-America divers Bob Weber and Curt Genders finished 12th and 14th, respectively, in high board diving finals. Earlier, Genders had finished 9th and Weber 10th in low-board diving.

In the 440-yard freestyle results. FSU's Paul Thompson placed 15th and Buck Hiles finished 20th. Thompson, Tallahassee sophomore, was timed in 4:37.4 and Hiles in 4:44.4 several seconds slower than his time in the 1959 NCCA 440.

Thompson placed 12th and Hiles 18th in the NCAA 220yard freestyle Friday.
