

Stacking up a 43-9 lead in the first six events, Florida State's spirited swimmers breezed to a 66-28 victory over Georgia before a season-opening full house at FSU's indoor pool last night.

All-America senior Buck Hiles of Atlanta flashed record-breaking form as Coach Bim Stults' Seminoles won their 17th straight dual meet and their 16th in a row over the Bulldogs.

#### FROSH, TOO

FSU's freshman squad, perhaps the best Baby Seminole swim team ever assembled, walloped Georgia's freshman by an almost identical score, 66-29, in the preliminary meet.

Hiles, brilliant in the beginning of his last season, and sophomore Bill Quayle each won two events as FSU captured nine of the 11 events and finished 1-2 in five individual races. Soph Risto Pyykko set a meet and school record in the 200-yard butterfly and senior All-America diver Curt Genders hit many of his dives in mid-season form in winning his specialty.

"It was a fine start," said Stults, "but we'll have to work like the devil to reach the condition we'll need for upcoming competition."

Stults may have had reference to the Seminoles' early-February match with powerful SMU at Dallas. The Southwest Conference entry placed high in last year's NCAA championship meet and will be favored to halt FSU's long victory string that dates back to

1957. Last night's meet was only minutes old before Hiles leaped off the starting block on the way to a meet, pool, and school record in the 200-yard individual medley. The hard-working Atlantan swam it in 2:09.8, cutting nearly five seconds off his own school record and almost six seconds off the former pool record set by SMU's Galyao in 1956. The time would have qualified Hiles in last year's NCAA 200 medley finals.

#### FASTEST HERE

Hiles also won the 100-yard

freestyle in :51.9-second time, the fastest 100 he's ever done in the FSU pool.

One of Hiles' school records (2:19.9 in the 200 butterfly) fell when Brooklyn soph Pyykko turned in a fine 2:19.3 clocking.

Quayle won both the 220 and 440-yard freestyle events as Seminole sophomores contributed 43½ points of FSU's 68-point total.

Georgia captain Rolffs Pinkerton was the only individual winner for the Bulldogs, nipping FSU's Jack Dunlap in the 50-yard freestyle.

Balance and depth paved the way in the Baby Seminoles' opening win. Despite the one-sided score, the FSU frosh had no double-winners while Georgia yearlings Justus Baird and Mike Walsh each won two events.
