ATHENS, Ga.—Florida's Gators appeared to be the chief opposition as FSU's Seminoles sought a repeat championship in the Georgia AAU swimming meet here today.

Sam Stalls' talented Tribe mowed down Georgia, 51-35, in a dual-meet warmup here yesterday. The victory raised FSU's record to 7-1 this season.

Buck Hiles and sophomore Pete Davis paced FSU's decision over the Bulldogs. Hiles set a Stegeman Hall pool mark of 2:09.8 in the 200-yard individual medley. He smashed the former record of 2:17.3 held by Phil Drake of Florida since 1958.

Davis topped his school record-

breaking 200-yard backstroke performance against Florida last week with a 2:12.8 clocking against Georgia.

FSU's freshmen won their seventh straight dual triumph, 61-21, over the Georgia frosh. Lee Bransford set a Seminole yearling

mark with a 23.4-second time in the 50-yard freestyle. The Baby Seminoles also will compete in the Georgia AAU today.
