

Florida State's swimming team outdistanced Sewanee, 68-32, Saturday in rivalry that saw two meet records improved.

Tony Kowals of FSU won the 200-yard backstroke in a record two minutes, 22.9 seconds. That erased a 2:25.4 mark set in 1958 by Bob Abstein, who swam then for Florida State's Seminoles but competed in today's meet as a Sewanee theology student.

Abstein, who changed schools after being injured last year, placed third in the 200 today.

Sherman Henderson of Florida State won the 200-yard breaststroke in 2:34.6, trimming the 1958 mark of 2:40.2 set by Bob Newell, also of FSU.

The Seminoles won eight of the 11 events. FSU's won-loss record now stands 4-1 and Sewanee is 2-4.
