

ATHENS, Ga. (AP)—Florida's powerhouse swimming team, unbeaten this year, held a five point lead going into finals today of the Southern College Invitational Championships.

At the halfway mark, the Gators held a scant 38-33 lead over Florida State. The Florida freshmen were in third place with 35 points, followed by Georgia, 12; Miami, 7; Georgia Tech 6; Emory 6, and Georgia Fresh 2.

The Gator varsity won four of the eight events last night. Florida freshman Charlie King upset varsity teammate, Eddie Reese, in the 200-yard breaststroke in pool record time of 2:22.4.

John Rangely of FSU, swimming unattached, defeated Miami Rick Chriss in the 80-yard freestyle. Both were clocked in 22.9.

Neal Allen of FSU was first in 1-meter diving, with teammate Jim Mayne third. FSU's Mark Cohen and Pete Davis finished two - three in the 400-yard individual medley, behind Florida's Eddie Reese. Paul Thompson, formerly of FSU and now unattached, was second and FSU's Rysto Pyyke third in the 200 butterfly, behind Florida's Jerry Livingston. A time of 2:04.1 by Livingston broke the pool record of 2:05.2 set last year by Thompson.

Thompson won the 200-yard freestyle with a time of 5:12.0.

**ATHENS, Ga. (AP)—**Florida's intercollegiate swimming team won five of eight events today to capture the Southern Collegiate Invitational championships with 114 points.

Rival Florida State was second with 104 points followed by Florida's Freshmen with 70. Georgia was fourth with 23 points followed by Miami with 15, Georgia Tech 13, Emory 7, and Georgia Freshman 6.

Dick Farwell of Florida set a pool record in the 100-yard backstroke with a time of 37.5. The old record of 37.9 was made by Georgia's Reid Patterson in 1963.

Florida's Terry Green nipped Miami's Rick Chrise in the 100-yard freestyle in one of the meet's best races. Green was timed in 48.7 and Chrise in 50.0. The pool record of 48.7 was set by Patterson in 1964.

The versatile Eddie Hecox of Florida was outstanding in a fine 200-yard individual medley field, winning in 2:07.8. He set the pool record of 2:06.6 in the trials.

In a close finish, Paul Thompson of Florida State, ineligible for the varsity this season and swimming unattached, nipped Florida's Terry Green to win the 200-yard freestyle in the fast time of 1:52.5. Green did it in 1:52.7. The old pool record was 1:57.4 set by Georgia freshman Buddy Weir in 1962.

Jerry Livingston of Florida turned in perhaps the day's top performance with a 51.0 clocking in the 100-yard butterfly, bettering his own pool record of 51.9 made in 1962.
